



Tier 1



SAFETY OF STUDENTS

The Safety of our students are of importance to us.

Security

□Parents are encouraged to drop your child at the entrance of the school.

Parents are required to register at the guard post if you are coming into the school with your child

SAFETY OF STUDENTS

Early Release

- □If your child is sick, parents would be required to come down and pick up your child.
- □You will be issued an Early Release Form to be submitted to the Security Guard.
- □ If your child has an appointment with the doctor, please inform the Form Teacher 2 days before the date.

Unwell/injured Student

Parents would be required to come down and pick up the child:

- □Update the contact list with the Form Teacher
- □We will only release the child to the **legal guardians**.
- □Special arrangements have to be provided in writing to the Principal if unlisted guardians are required to pick up the child.

SAFETY OF STUDENTS

Driving

Within school

- Cars are only allowed into the school premises from 6.30am to 7.30am
- The school gate will be **closed at 7.30am**.
- Cars will not be allowed into the school premises after 8.00 am, unless picking up your sick child

Road Just Outside the school

- Drivers to follow the traffic rules and to not put the children at risk.
- □ No Right-Turn at the gate (between 0700 0800)
- Drivers are not to park their vehicles along Tampines Avenue 9 after dismissal.
- Use HDB car park at Block 496F when picking up your child/ward during school dismissal time.



Working together

EXPECTATIONS ON LATE COMING

- The school takes late-coming and absenteeism seriously
- Student must report to school punctually by 7.30 am.
- Students who are not present during the singing of the National Anthem will be deemed as late.
- Student who are late more than 8 or more times in a term will be required to serve detention during recess/ after school hours
- Late-coming is considered a discipline case and your child's Conduct Grade will be affected.

EXPECTATIONS ON ABSENTEEISM

- Students are expected to be in school on all school days.
- If a student is unable to come to school, please inform the school by contacting the FT/school or drop an email to the school.
 - When a students is unwell, he/she should see a doctor and remain home to recover till the medical certificate (MC) has expired.
 - A medical certificate must be produced if your child is absent from school. This should be handed to the child's FT when your child returns to school
 - <u>Up to 5 parent letters per semester</u> will be accepted for absence from school due to valid reasons.
- Absence from school without a valid reason is <u>considered truancy</u> and will be deemed as a discipline issue, resulting in a drop in your child's Conduct Grade.

EXPECTATIONS ON ABSENTEEISM

• Overseas travel for leisure or family bonding is <u>strongly discouraged</u> during the school term and will be deemed as not a valid reason for absence.

PERSONAL BELONGINGS

- Students are not encouraged to bring their mobile phones to school.
 - If your child does bring their mobile phones, he/she will be solely responsible for their own devices and the school is not liable for any loss, theft, or damage to the devices. Students must ensure phone is switched off in school at all times.
- Smart Wrist watches (with audio/video functions) are not allowed .
- Students are also not allowed to have in their possession any weapon / weapon-like item which can be used to cause harm to others

EXPECTATION OF SCHOOL RULES- GROOMING

- Students are to wear their prescribed school uniform and modification to the school uniform is not allowed.
- Due to safety reasons, please ensure that apart from their watch, your child does not wear any accessories on their wrist/arm.
- All students are required to wear their school uniform on non-PE/CCA days, unless during the heat wave periods.
- Shoes should be completely white, socks should be above the ankle
- A spot-check will be conducted once a month to check on your child's grooming and students will be provided a checklist for parents to address the concerns.

SOME SUGGESTIONS IN SUPPORTING YOUR CHILD...

- Remind him/her to sleep early so as not to be late for school the next day. Punctuality is an important value.
- □ Take time to **talk to your child** about school and friends.
- □ Communicate your expectations with your child and **provide encouragement** from time to time.
- □ Ensure your child does and submit their homework promptly
- **Remind** your child to **follow school rules**.
- □ Educate your child on **road traffic rules**
